Sine Nomine is a chamber choir which focuses on sacred choral music. Under the direction of Dr. John Hooper, the ensemble has performed at a variety of venues in Alberta and has partnered with such organizations as Concordia University College, the Alberta Provincial Museum, Da Camera Singers, the King's University College, Edmonton City Hall, Holy Trinity Anglican Church, Concordia Lutheran Seminary, and the Edmonton Eskimos. Repertoire has ranged from choral octavos to short cantatas and anthems from historical composers and works by living composers.

Sine Nomine was formed in the fall of 2000 by alumni of Concordia Concert Choir and has since expanded to include young adult singers from a variety of university singing experiences. After existing without a name in its early stages, the choir adopted the name of Sine Nomine, which is Latin for "without a name". Coincidentally, Sine Nomine is also the name of Ralph Vaughn Williams' popular hymn tune, commonly known as "For All the Saints".

Dr. John Hooper is the director of the School of Music at Concordia University College where he conducts the Concordia Concert Choir and Jubilosio! Bells of Concordia and teaches conducting, choral methods, choral literature, and composition. He is also known as a guest conductor, workshop leader, and clinician.
